The AP Access for All (APAA) program in Tennessee takes pride in its achievements in supporting schools and students across the state. Our primary goal is to offer educational opportunities that were previously inaccessible to many students. Through APAA, participating schools have broadened their course selections, focusing on subjects typically not available on campus. This school year, APAA is proud to be serving over 2,100 students from 242 high schools, playing a role in the overall growth of statewide enrollment in advanced placement courses.

- **Region 1** – 65% growth in enrollments from Fall '23 to Spring '24
